Term 4 Update

From Monday there were some easing of restrictions within NSW Schools that will remain in place for the remainder of term 4.

Any visitors to a school who will be on site for longer than a drop off or pick up is required to have received two doses of the COVID-19 vaccine. Some exemptions apply. I am required to ensure that you have signed into the school correctly via the QR check-in and are able to show proof of your vaccination. Please be aware that you will be asked until further notice as per the Government guidelines.

How to play:


Roll the dice and do the matching exercise (for example if you roll a '3' do a squat)
